Dear foster parent,

We thank you for helping us place homeless dogs into loving homes. If you would like to foster a dog for St. Martin's Animal Foundation, please read, sign, and submit this agreement.

Our rescue team worked tirelessly, rescuing dogs that are going to be euthanized from high kill shelters. We don't always know their personalities, so we try to match the dogs with the right foster families. Once you agree that you would like to foster a dog, our charity is not responsible if you get scratched, nipped, or bitten. It is up to you to further analyze the animal's personality and keep us up-to-date with what transpires. We do our best to make sure the dog is super friendly and easy to care for. If, for some reason, the dog shows signs of aggression, which could be due to disease or an old injury, contact one of our reps immediately, and we will pick up the dog within a few days, depending on where the foster home is located.

Requirements:

- The dog is to have filtered water and healthy food while in foster care.
- The dog is not be introduced to any aggressive dogs while in foster care.
- The dog should not be watched or walked by children, only adults.
- The dog should always have shade and water.
- Flea baths must be approved to avoid the use of toxic chemicals.
- If the dog gets ill, you will need to contact one of the Saint Martin's Animal Foundation members at the above email and phone contacts.
- ID tags with our contact number must be on the dogs all the time. If the tag falls off, let us know, and we will mail you another one.
- Please send us updates every few days and photos for our records. We'd like to create stories to garner interest for adoption. The more photos, the better.
